

Boom Truck (Crane Truck) Operators Certification Course

OSHA regulations require that only qualified and authorized boom truck operators or operator trainees, under the direct supervision of a qualified boom truck operator, shall be permitted to operate boom trucks. To ensure that only qualified personnel operate boom trucks, OSHA regulations require that operators successfully complete a crane operator qualification process.

Our on-site, customized boom truck operator training is designed to provide the information and testing to help ensure that your organization's boom truck operators' are able to operate your boom trucks safely and effectively in most situations. Our tailored training consists of both classroom training with written testing, and hands-on training with practical testing. Below is a brief outline of our basic starting point that will be adapted to meet the needs and skill levels of your organization.

Exams

Certification requirements include passing a single written exam and a practical exam, focus on specifics that apply only to Boom Truck (Crane Truck). (Such as the use of remote or pendant controls.)

During the written exam, trainees are allowed 90 minutes to answer 34 comprehensive questions designed to encompass every aspect of Boom Truck safe operation and 20 questions on Rigging regulations.

The practical exam puts individuals in simulated real world settings with live equipment and allows them to demonstrate their crane operation proficiency by requiring them to:

- Perform an Inspection of the Equipment
- Hoisting (with and without a load)
- Operating the boom (with and without a load)
- Swinging the boom (with and without a load)
- Accurately Follow Hand Signals
- Combine these skills to the instructor's satisfaction
